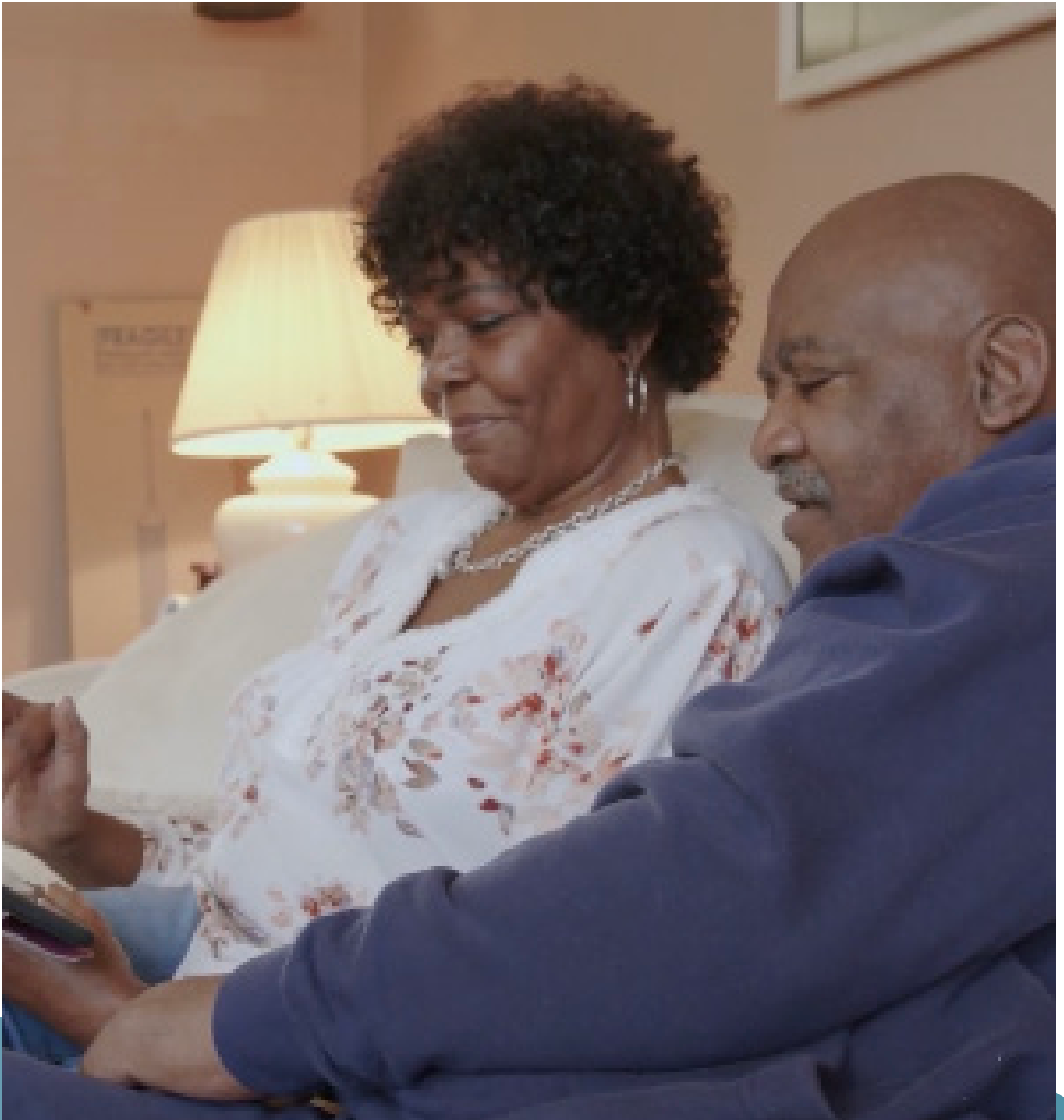

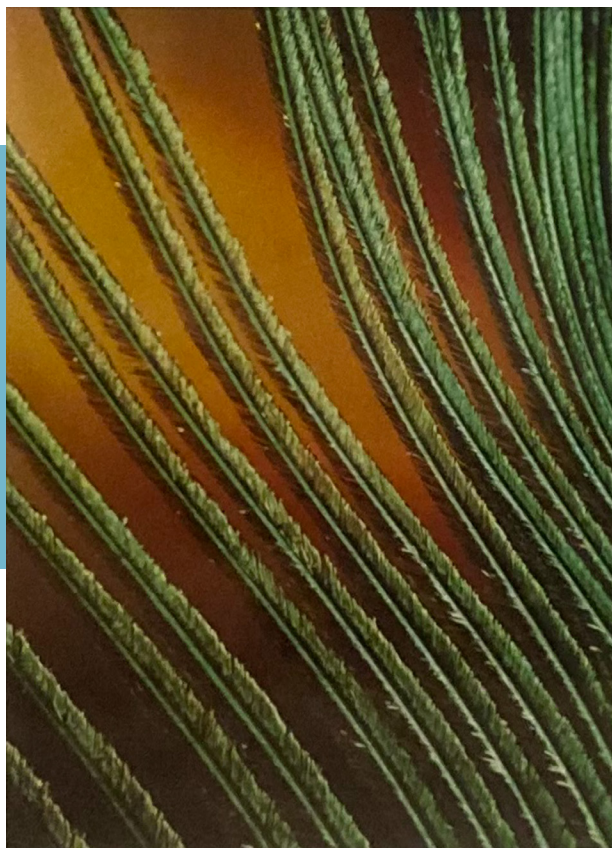
provide. After visiting and seeing how the work is displayed in each office, they are even more secure in knowing that they donated this body of work to the right organization.

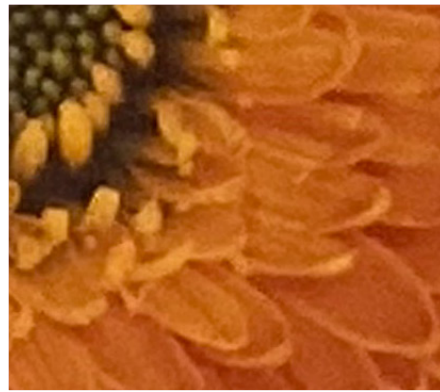
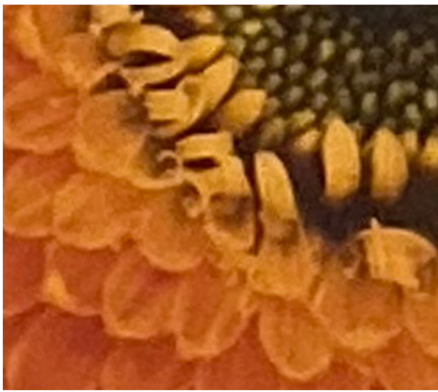
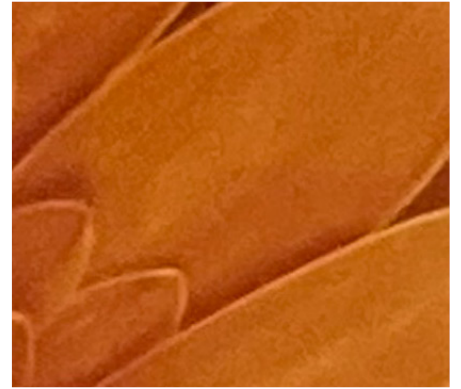

# HONORING SERVICE, SHARING COMPASSION:

## VETERANS SUPPORTING VETERANS

### ALAN: A NAVY VETERAN GIVING BACK

A retired Navy Captain, who served aboard the nuclear cruiser USS Long Beach during the Vietnam War and later in the Naval Reserves where he achieved the rank of Captain, Alan brings his own military experience to connect naturally with patients. For more than 15 years, he has dedicated himself to visiting and honoring fellow veterans.

Through Veterans Pinning Ceremonies and personal visits, Alan offers recognition, understanding, and the bond that only a fellow veteran can share. Through volunteering, Alan helps any way he can to help veterans find peace and dignity in their final days. “They often share stories they haven’t told their families. My job is to listen and let them speak,” he explained.

One of Alan’s most powerful memories came from his very first pinning ceremony.

The patient was Eddie, a World War II veteran and beloved family friend who had worked for Alan’s family for decades. “Eddie never received the four medals he had earned during the war,” Alan shared. “His daughter told me that wasn’t uncommon at the time, especially for Black soldiers. So, I made some calls and within a week, we had his medals.” Alan gathered 17 of Eddie’s family members at his bedside. Dressed in his Navy uniform, Alan led the ceremony, reading each medal citation as family members pinned them to Eddie’s chest. “There wasn’t a dry eye in the room,” Alan said. “He passed about a week later, but I’ll never forget saluting him that day—he finally got the recognition he deserved.”

## FRED: RESPECT AND PRESENCE

For Fred, his mission when volunteering with our Veteran patient community is simple: “It’s about respect, compassion, and being present. Every veteran deserves that.” As a U.S. Army veteran who served from 1962 to 1964 during the Vietnam era, Fred’s volunteering with Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta is deeply personal. For over a decade “When I visit or take part in a pinning ceremony, it’s about one thing—honor,” Fred shared. “All veterans deserve the respect of our country, and as a fellow veteran, I want to show them that respect personally. I want them to be proud of their service and to feel appreciated.”

Fred’s own military experience helps him connect naturally with veterans at the bedside. “It helps a lot,” he said. “We talk about our time in service and share stories. It’s a shared experience—something that connects us instantly.”

Those connections often bring comfort not only to patients, but to their families as well. Fred recalled a recent ceremony for a Navy veteran whose wife was present. “He was so proud of his time in the Navy—his father had served too,” Fred said. “When we pinned him and gave him his certificate, his wife was deeply touched. You could tell how much it meant to both of them to have that recognition.”

## ALICE: COMPASSION FROM THE HEART

For Alice, an Army veteran who served from 1993 to 1997, volunteering with Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta is more than service — it’s a calling. “My mother was the one who inspired me,” she shared. “When I cared for her through illness in high school, something in me knew this was what I was meant to do. God placed in me the heart to care for others — to remind people that they matter.”

That same compassion guides their work today, especially when honoring fellow veterans through her volunteer visits and pinning ceremonies. “Being a veteran myself gives me a connection,” they said. “We’re family — every branch, every story. When I meet another veteran, I want them to know they’re not forgotten. Even at the end of life, they matter.”

One recent pinning ceremony left a veteran in tears: “He didn’t think he deserved to be honored. I told him, ‘Yes, you do. What you did matters.’” For Alice the mission is simple but powerful: show compassion, offer peace, and remind each person that they are cared for. “It’s not just about the veteran,” they added. “It’s about the family too — helping them feel supported, seen, and loved. This work is about heart. You can’t do it without one!”

Through amazing, self-less volunteers like Alan, Fred, and Alice, willing to donate the gifts of their time and talent, Visiting Nurse can ensure that veterans are honored, remembered, and supported—not only in life’s final chapter but in the profound dignity and compassion they deserve.





# CARLA & ANTONIO: A JOURNEY OF STRENGTH, SURVIVAL & COMMUNITY SUPPORT

When we first welcomed Carla Taylor’s son Antonio into our Medicaid waiver SOURCE program in June of 2023, we saw what so many people overlook: a mother whose strength had carried her son through decades of unimaginable medical crises—and who still greeted every day with faith, humor, and determination.

Carla’s son, Antonio, was just 15½ when his life changed. A very rare kidney disease, one that typically affects Caucasian men in their 40s, attacked both his kidneys and heart. His kidney function had dropped to 2–5%, and he was given only 2.5 years to live.

But Antonio had other plans than to settle with that prognosis. He was very determined, as he always had been.

In the more than twenty years since that first diagnosis, he has endured and survived more than 30 major surgeries, including:

- two kidney transplants
- two open-heart surgeries, including valve repairs
- multiple knee surgeries
- congestive heart failure
- life-threatening infections
- placement of a pacemaker
- and repeated cardiac events, including episodes in which he flatlined.

Through every hospitalization, every emergency, every long night, Carla never left her son’s side. “Doctors would see me and ask, ‘Who are you?’” she recalls. “I’d tell them ‘My son listens for my voice. I speak to him even under anesthesia, and he responds.’ They saw his response, and eventually would tell me, ‘Don’t go far, he needs you.’ And I’ve stayed—every moment.”

Now, in addition to being his mother, she now took on a new role of healthcare advocate. She was his voice and his source of strength.

## FINDING SOMEONE TO HELP—WHEN THEY NEEDED IT MOST

For years, Carla balanced working full-time in corporate management with the overwhelming demands of caring for her medically fragile son. Eventually, she retired, knowing she had to choose his health over her career. But caring for Antonio alone was not sustainable.

Then a friend told her about Visiting Nurse Health System’s SOURCE program, which provides coordinated in-home services and care management for people living with chronic illness or disabilities. Carla prayed for guidance—and she says her prayers were answered the day she connected with Visiting Nurse.

“God sent me to SOURCE,” Carla says. “SOURCE has been an exceptional blessing for my family—supporting Antonio and

supporting me.” Through SOURCE, Carla and Antonio received:

- a dedicated care coordinator, checking on them regularly
- medical coordination across Antonio’s 10–15 providers/specialists
- support for daily needs like bathing, meal prep, and mobility
- education on disease management
- emotional and caregiver support
- access to safety tools like ADT medical alert monitoring
- and a rapid response when emergencies occurred.

She is not exaggerating, as one of those emergencies happened when Antonio suddenly collapsed at home. The alert device alerted help quickly, just in time to discover he was going into adrenal crisis due to complications from a failed kidney transplant, leading to another heart failure, which he also survived. “They were there for us,” Carla says. “We were not alone.”

#### A MOTHER’S STRENGTH—A SON’S DETERMINATION

Even beyond his medical battles, Antonio has endured trauma no young man should face. Years ago, a close friend suffered a mental break and violently attacked him. Antonio survived hours of torture, a broken tailbone, and a near-execution. SWAT arrived just in time to save his life.

No matter what he has encountered, through it all, his spirit remains unshaken. His humor remains intact—once joking with doctors that he’d take his dad’s heart if they wouldn’t give him one of their own. His faith remains steady. His will to live remains powerful. “My son is strong—stronger than anyone knows,” Carla says. “He’s determined to live. And I’m determined to advocate for him.”

Today, at 37 years old, living decades beyond the prognosis he was given, Antonio is focused on regaining strength for what they hope will become a third kidney transplant. And Carla? She continues to support Antonio as a mother, caregiver and healthcare advocate. Knowing the very hard job it is to be a caregiver, Carla also works diligently to care for herself. Recently she proudly completed a long-standing goal she had by earning her degree, graduating with a bachelor’s degree in business administration, with honors.

“I am grateful for Visiting Nurse’s Community Care program,” she says. “I have wonderful friends and support through my providers. I’m grateful for the teams that checks on me, prays with me, supports me, and makes sure I can keep caring for my son.”

#### HOW DID THE VISITING NURSE COMMUNITY IMPACT CARLA & ANTONIO?

Families like Carla and Antonio’s are the heartbeat of Visiting Nurse Health System’s services. They are at the core as to why this organization has existed for over 7 decades of care. Without Visiting Nurse, patients and families would not have a place for answers, for information, for education, and of course, quality care that they deserve.

In Antonio’s case, the Community Care division program SOURCE, supports his needs, and qualifying individuals needing nursing home level of care and want to remain living in their home. Many of the families served have nowhere else to turn, yet they need in-home nursing, chronic disease management, caregiver support, and long-term coordinated care simply to survive. To understand the need is so great, those who qualify for the SOURCE program, are living on the Social Security Index. In 2024, the maximum payment amount for an individual was \$943 per month.

Carla says it best: “If we didn’t have SOURCE as an option, I don’t know how we would have made it. This program is priceless. And many families need this—many don’t even know it exists.”

Those who donate to Visiting Nurse’s Charitable Care make this care possible. Every gift to Visiting Nurse ensures that families like Carla and Antonio continue receiving the support, advocacy, and healthcare they rely on to stay safe at home. “We are meant to help others,” Carla says. “If our story can help someone else on their journey, then that is why we’re here.”
